Annnual WCARG Christmas Party...


Will be held December 9th, 9:00 am at the Walker County Storm Shelter.



NEW RMS STATIONS INSTALLED AT OUR TOWER SITE

On October 16, 2023 we installed the two RMS stations at the tower site that is utilized by the WCARG club.

The two stations were as follows:

- VHF 145.030 MHz. configured for WIN-LINK VHF PACKET under the station designation of KM5VC-10.
- UHF 446.150 MHz. configured for WIN-LINK VARA FM under the station designation of KM5VC-11.

These stations are operational 24/7 and are powered by batteries in order to maintain their operation during power outages.

Hopefully local operators will now have easier access and ability to communicate through the WINLINK system by utilizing this equipment.

75th Anniversary Special Event 5 – 11 November 2023

The Air Force Military Auxiliary Radio System (AFMARS) celebrates 75 years of service to United States Military and Civilian government organizations during November 2023. In observance of this milestone, the "Air Force MARS 75 Years" Special Event will include communications on Amateur HF bands (160-6) in the General License portion of the band and in the Technician License portion of 10 meters using SSB, CW and digital modes.

Those wishing to participate should listen for the above-listed stations (frequencies will vary by geographic region) and respond to the "Air Force MARS 75 Years CQ" calls.

Stations which have made a confirmed contact with one or more Communication Wings will be eligible to receive an electronic certificate. Stations contacting 5 wings will be awarded a "Bronze" endorsement. Contact with 10 wings will be denoted "Silver". Stations contacting all 10 Wings and the Pentagon and Travis AFB stations will receive "Gold" endorsements on their QSL Certificates.

EMP TECH TALK

How to prepare for an EMP

EMP-Electromagnetic Pulse and the Radio Amateur

An electromagnetic pulse (EMP) is a short burst of electromagnetic energy. It can be caused by natural phenomena such as lightning strikes, or by man-made events such as nuclear explosions. EMP can damage or destroy electronic equipment, depending on the strength of the pulse and the type of equipment.

Radio amateurs are particularly vulnerable to EMP because their equipment often uses antennas, which are excellent conductors of electricity. If an EMP hits an antenna, it can induce a high voltage surge that can travel through the radio equipment and damage or destroy it. There are a number of things that radio amateurs can do to protect their equipment from EMP:

- Use shielded enclosures. Metal enclosures can help to block EMP from reaching the electronic components inside.
- **Install surge protectors.** Surge protectors can help to absorb the energy of an EMP surge before it reaches the radio equipment.
- Use low-power equipment. Lower-power equipment is generally less susceptible to EMP damage.
- **Disconnect the radio equipment from the antenna when it is not in use.** This will help to prevent EMP from traveling from the antenna to the radio equipment.

In addition to these technical measures, radio amateurs can also help to prepare for an EMP event by developing a communication plan for their community. This plan should include a list of radio frequencies and modes that will be used in the event of an EMP, as well as a list of emergency contacts.

Here are some additional tips for radio amateurs to prepare for an EMP event:

- Have a backup power source for your radio equipment. This could be a battery-powered radio, a solar-powered radio, or a generator.
- Have a backup antenna that is not connected to your home or other buildings. This could be a portable antenna, a
 dipole antenna, or a vertical antenna.
- Have a plan for communicating with other radio amateurs in the event of an EMP. This could include using a specific frequency or mode, or using a predetermined meeting place.
- Be familiar with the basics of emergency communication. This includes knowing how to use a variety of radio modes, such as CW (Morse code) and SSB (single sideband).

By taking these steps, radio amateurs can help to protect their equipment and their ability to communicate in the event of an EMP event.




