


February Demonstration

We Need Certified Trainers for the Technician Day Class...



I'ts K4TeXaN again!

I'm inviting you to join in the club's new endeavor to assist prospective members in becoming a licensed Amateur Radio Operator with our Technician Day Class. We will be offering a 6 hour session to cover ALL questions in the Technician level question pool, and testing immediately afterwards. Thus greatly increasing the probability of them passing the test and earning their Technician license.

The prospect will be given information regarding where to get study information and materials in an email or a download link to the <u>prospectivemember.pdf</u> document that y'all may download and pass on to anyone interested. When they are ready to test, they can participate in either our standard test session at our monthly meeting, or we can schedule the 6 hour Technician Day Class to give them one last chance to go over the material directly before testing at the end of that session.

If you wish to participate as in Instructor or Volunteer Examiner or both please let me know at the email in the signature of this email. As I am the License Instructor Team Coordinator. To take part in this we ask that you be one or both of 2 things. An ARRL Registered License Instructor and/or a Volunteer Examiner. As a License Instructor you can be any level Amateur Radio Operator, as to instruct you must me at or above the level of course you are instructing. This means that Technicians may participate as Instructors. As a Volunteer Examiner you must be General or Extra class to administer a Technician level examination.

If you are not yet an ARRL Registered License Instructor, it is easy to acquire.

- 1. You must be an ARRL member (skip if already a member...duh)
 You can Register for an account and join the ARRL here.

- 2. Make sure you fulfill the requirements as a Registered Instructor. (you all do) https://www.arrl.org/license-instructor-qualifications
- 3. Register as a License Instructor
 https://www.arrl.org/License-instructor-registration
- 4. Opon receiving your approval email, login and print your certificate.

Login - https://www.arrl.org and "Login" top center.

Click your name top center to go to your account.

Select "Volunteer Positions" on left to verify "Instructor" is listed.

Back button to previous page and select "My Certificates".

Select "License Instructor Certificate".

Select "Generate Certificate". This will create a .pdf for you to download and print.

If you are not yet a Volunteer Examiner, it is also easy to acquire.

- 1. Download the ARRL Volunteer Examiner Manual
- 2. Read chapter 2 of the manual which explains the VE accreditation process.
- Complete the ARRL <u>VE Application Form and Open-Book Review</u>. Please email, fax, or mail/courier, a PDF file or scanned photo image to the VEC. Additional instructions are located on Become an <u>ARRL VE page</u>.



Ryan K4TXN gives an excellent Presentation at the Feb meeting

Free software! Android only. Not on the Play Store.

AndFlmsg - The .apk file is the app you download to your Android device.

USB port is NOT OTG (On The Go). It will only work for charging and file transfer.

You can use this with ANY radio! The tablet plays the sound from it's speakers. You PTT the radio so the mic pics up that sound and transmits it.

Or you can hardwire it with the following cable.

This will utilize the 3.5mm headphone/mic jack on the tablet to a F-Type connector to the radio with VOX turned on.

Side Note - If you have a Mobilinkd TNC for KISS TNC operations, this tablet will Bluetooth to it for use with WOaD (Winlink on Android) and APRSDroid. It does not however have GPS, so you will need to manually set your location. With a \$10 32Gb SDCard inserted to the tablet, you can use Maps.me app to download an offline map of the entire United States at about 12Gb. You then manually find your location on the map, and it will give you the GPS coordinates for that location. All Offline.

On the not-so-cheap.

With a higher end Android tablet or phone with a USB port that is OTG (On The Go). This type of USB port will work as an audio outlet, usb data transfer, serial port, etc...

Couple it with a DigiRig. USB cable to Digirig, and proper cable from DigiRig to your radio.

The Digirig works as both Sound Card and Serial Port. You can control the audio and PTT of most radios.

This can be used to control a HT or HF rig. Doing a SOTA activation with a IC-705? Bring this to do some data after a successful activation.

HELP FOR NET CONTROLLERS

Comments about being a "Net Control Operator" from Russ NR5US



Greetings to all from Russ NR5US

First, being a net controller is a cool thing and kudos to those willing to step up and swing that bat! I liken the position of NCS to Moses coming down from the mountain to lead his people!

Before we make any drastic changes, I would ask each of us to look into the mirror before "Monday Morning Quarterbacking" the NCS and ask yourself, did I do everything that I could to help that poor soul net controller who has been thrown to the wolves? Am I giving feedback and suggestions about running the net when I myself will not take my turn in the barrel? If you are one of those members who refuse to do the net, please don't read anymore of my blog and please switch-off! So, if you are still with me, I want to share some suggestions from lessons learned after pushing tin around for 31 years at the FAA.

For those checking in.....(Future NCS's)

- 1. Am I using phonetics as asked?
- 2. Am I keying the microphone (without a .5 sec pause) and rambling on while the repeater is delayed to transmit the DCS and a partial callsign gets out on the air causing mass confusion?
- 3. Am I speaking in a normal tone and speech rate when giving my callsign?
- 4. Am I paying attention to the fact that there may be similar callsigns ie; N5GLO/KI5YLO/WW7OO......."well net control, all I heard was an "O", so here are my comments.....?
- 5. Am I engaged in 2 or 3 other nets simultaneously and cannot listen to any one net?
- 6. Am I giving NCS every opportunity to copy my callsign correctly so as to not hear the dreaded words....."say again?"
- 7. Will I offer "RECHECKS" only when asked for RECHECKS and not throw the NCS off script?
- 8. Will I be courteous no matter how the net goes? There are a whole bunch of folks listening to our repeater as the WCARG is surfacing as the premiere amateur radio club.

For the poor NCS.....

- 1. Do not loose control. If you hear a partial call sign, ask specifically about that callsign if known. Simply asking to call again may be inviting 3 or 4 stations that doubled to create more problems. ie;"all I got was a partial callsign ending in Sierra....please say again".
- 2. Dead air is an invitation for disaster. Refer to the first sentence in number 1.
- 3. Am I organized and ready to copy callsigns in an organized and efficient manner?
- 4. Do I understand that bloody "Echolink" system and prepared to deal with the latency?
- 5. Am I prepared to call the echolink stations in an orderly manner if you have been provided a list of stations that are logged in? If I (Russ) am here, I will have the link up and provide that list. If I am not here, the link will be down.
- 6. Am I prepared to move on immediately if the station being called does not answer?
- 7. Am I prepared to improvise and use a process to gain the information I need quickly? ie....."that was a train wreck on out of county guests....are there any Montgomery County check-in's...."
- 8. Am I focused on the clock to keep everyone interested and terminate the net within a reasonable amount of time?
- 9. Will I remain courteous no matter how the net goes? Refer to number 8 in the above.

Before we get into a knee-jerk reaction, lets focus on house cleaning and consider these suggestions to work the net more efficiently. No one likes change and I am saying that we can stay where we are if we work together. Take on the challenge of putting 10 lbs. of crap into a 5 lb bag. Repack your bag so you can get 10 speedos instead of five for your trip to the beach. I remain steadfast that Echolink, while archaic at best, is the only means available for members who are less fortunate to be a part of the group. I see callsigns who are dues and money contributing members using Echolink to keep in touch with our great club. (Frank, K9ALF and AI, N5URR are good examples) At this time there are only 5 stations allowed to check in on the link, just five. However, if Echolink is seen as the problem and the club as a collective feels that it is too burdensome, the link will go away permanently.


